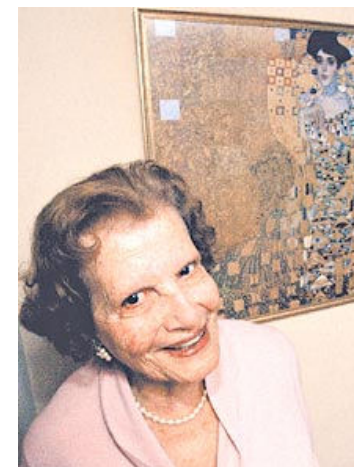

After spotting art stolen by the Nazis in a New Hampshire home, Jane was inspired to write a murder mystery featuring Josie Prescott, an antiques appraiser. *Consigned to Death*, the first in a traditional mystery series, was published in 2006 to outstanding critical and fan praise. *Deadly Appraisal*, the second in the series that's been referred to as an *Antiques Roadshow* for mystery fans, has just been published. The Josie Prescott antiques mysteries are set on the rugged seacoast of New Hampshire where Jane owned a rare books and antiques business. She and her husband now live in New York City.
